



his modern residence draws inspiration from nature and is a far cry from its original structure. The existing house was an old fisherman's cottage that was made of fibro, tin and timber. The brief was to replace this cottage with a fresh and modern design that took advantage of the beautiful surrounding views and created a warm, inviting ambience for a busy family.

The dwelling now includes four bedrooms, four bathrooms, a family room, dining, kitchen and separate formal lounge, as well as a study, pool and balconies that overlook the majestic views. With the design prowess of Phillip Corben of Corben Architects and Ruth Meli of Meli Studio, as well as Joe Meli's building experience, this family hub was built specifically to suit the client's needs.

A number of design considerations were taken into account. The size and unusual shape of the land had to be accommodated to ensure the home achieved a consistent and seamless flow, despite its tricky nature. A combination of natural materials that catch the eye was something Ruth really wanted to bring to the space. "Timber, sandstone and marble were used to play on the natural surrounding beauty and to complement the building," she notes. The team made it possible to enjoy the Sydney



headlands from as many rooms in the house as possible and it is a standout feature of the overall design.

It's easy to see nature's inspired look captured in the home's interior finishes. The kitchen features northern box timber flooring as well as a CaesarStone Ice Snow benchtop, metallic coffee-coloured polyurethane cupboards and brushbox timber veneers. Northern box timber flooring appears again in the dining space, as well as a stunning natural wooden stick pendant light that hangs over the dining table.

Medici marble feature tiles in the wet areas are an ode to nature, while teak decking, Himalayan sandstone and an exquisite water feature grace the outdoor space.

A pool in the small backyard is the epitome of family style. This addition makes the space
